CED Project Highlights

Community Strategic Planning

Developed a community driven plan for how we would engage in community economic development. This plan was recently renewed for the next 3 years.

Business Retention and Expansion Projects

Partnered with the Town of East Gwillimbury to deliver a Business Retention and Expansion study which has become the strategic guide for the ongoing activities of the Town's Business Development Committee. Similar projects are now starting in Brock Township and the Town of Georgina. We are a partner in each of those projects.

Community Visioning

Supported a broad community visioning process in Georgina which is now a clear part of the development of a broader economic development strategy for the Town of Georgina.

Education

Support ongoing small business education through workshops and seminars.

Small Business Week

Took the lead role in delivering Small Business Week in East Gwillimbury, Georgina and Brock. All of the local Chambers have begun to partner with us in this program.

EODP Program Highlights

South Shore Community Broadband

Supported the development of this key community asset through Community Capacity funding, Youth Internships, and Skills Development support.

Georgina Trades Training Inc.

Supported the development of this post secondary education facilitation organization through Community Capacity funding, a Youth Internship, and Skills Development support.

Sharon Temple Museum Society

Supported the development of this organization, as a local tourism destination, through Community Capacity funding, Youth Internships and Local Initiatives support for sales and marketing improvements.

Mount Albert Downtown

Supported a downtown streetscaping initiative with Local Initiatives funds.

East Gwillimbury Fall Festival

Provided seed support to a new Fall event celebrating music and rural life.

Beaverton Dog Sled Races

Provided support through Local Initiatives funds to seed the initial one day event and supported its growth to a three day event. It has now become one of the premier races on the provincial circuit.

Beaverton Trails

Supported the development of a local trails system in partnership with the Beaverton District Chamber of Commerce and the Beaverton Lions Club.

Distance Learning

Supported the development of local distance learning capacity through the Brock Public Library.
